To help your child at school we will endeavour to:

- Provide a safe and friendly atmosphere
- Provide a high quality and creative curriculum that meets the needs of your child.
- Encourage children to work hard and behave well.
- Share information with you about your child and keep you informed as to how your child is getting on.
- Promote the importance of regular attendance and punctuality.
- Actively welcome you into the life of the school.
- Communicate with you about events and key dates during the year.
- Provide a range of resources to support children's learning.
- Involve other professional services when necessary (with your permission).
- Be available, by mutual agreement, to discuss any concerns you might have about your child's progress or general welfare.
- Where relevant, set homework which helps to reinforce skills learnt at school.
- Provide a range of extra-curricular activities designed to enrich the children's school experience.
- Contact you if there is a persistent problem concerning your child's attendance, punctuality or behaviour.

PARENTS/CARERS

To help my child at school I will endeavour to:

- Ensure that my child goes to bed at a reasonable time on week days and has breakfast in the morning.


Social Media

Parents of children in North Yorkshire schools are increasingly using social networking sites such as Facebook to talk to their friends. Sometimes parents have used these sites to criticise or make inappropriate comments about schools or even individual teachers. Making defamatory comments on the internet has exactly the same serious legal consequences as if they are made directly to someone else. Legal action could be taken against the person who has made the online comment. Similarly threats of violence can lead to criminal proceedings under the Malicious Communications Act 1988.

We therefore ask that parents do not post any comments, photographs or videos, positive or negative, about the school, its staff or pupils on any social media.

If you have concerns about anything which happens in school please speak to your child's class teacher or the Headteacher who will do their best to resolve things. If you are still unhappy we have a complaints procedure which will ensure that your concerns are investigated thoroughly and appropriate action taken.
