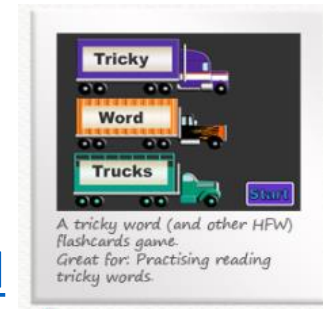

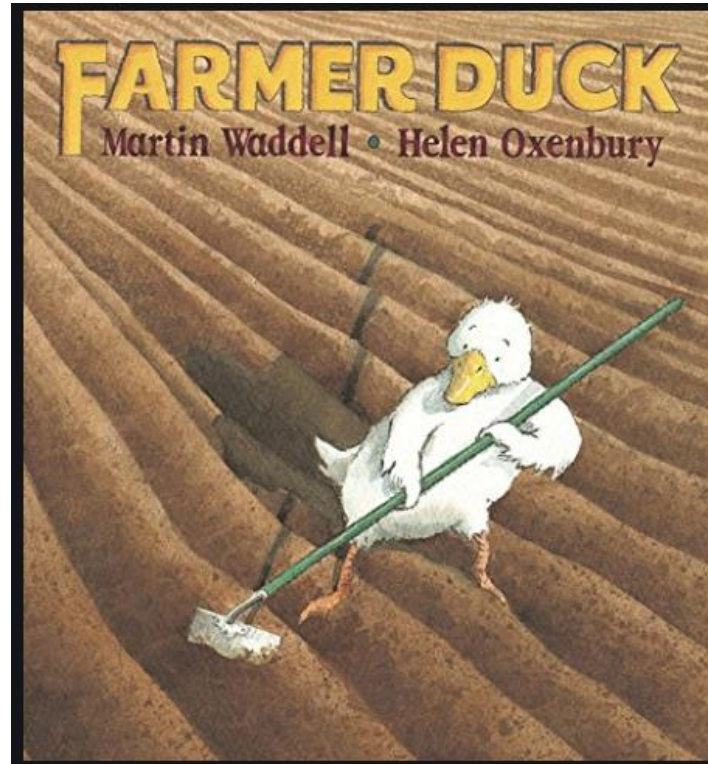


Literacy
