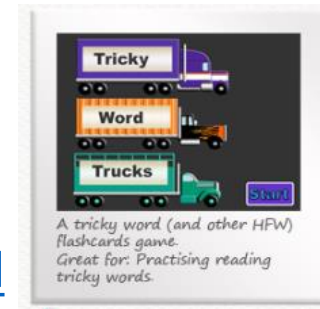

Write some sentences about the picture.

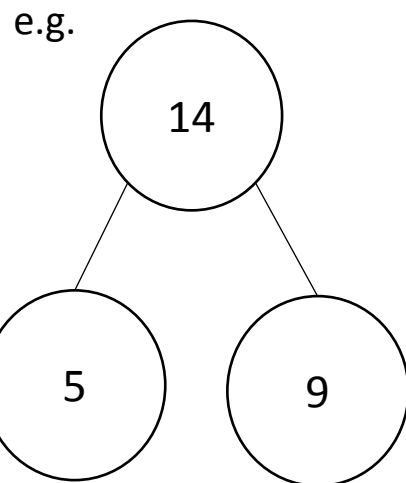


Example: This food is good for you.
