Legend has it that on good Friday (vendredi Saint), the bells (les cloches) of every church (église) in France fly to Rome, carrying with them the grief of those who mourn Jesus' crucifixion on that day. In keeping with the tradition, French bells do not ring from Good Friday to Easter Sunday (dimanche de Pâques) morning when the bells are said to return. The sound of the bells on Easter Sunday morning heralds the celebration of the resurrection, declaring that Jesus is alive again. The Easter bells are believed to bring with them Easter Eggs (des oeufs de Pâques), chocolates and other treats.
