Year 1 Phonics

Our final phonics lesson for this week is about words ending in the sound 'v'.

When you hear a word that ends in the sound 'v' it usually has an 'e' after it that we don't hear. For example, **give, have, live** and **love**.

How quickly can you write those words down?






There are apples on each ten frame.


