Year 2 Phonics

- For example

- Now can you put them into a sentence.

Year 1 Phonics

Today we are going to be reviewing the 'ch' digraph. We already know words such as **chin, chip** and **rich**.

In some words, the 'ch' digraph can be spelt using 'tch'. Have a go at reading my words below?

catch, pitch, fetch, notch, ditch and **kitchen**

Can you sort my words into ch and tch? Have a go at writing a list of words with ch and a list of tch.

catch, pitch, church, perch, crutch, chips, chomp, latch

Can you read my sentence?

Will you fetch the children?


Year 1 - Maths






